Deadlines and Guidelines

After an appropriate period of discernment, but no later than the end of the second semester of your second year, you must select a major field of study under the following guidelines:

- To be accepted as a major in a particular field of study, you must have maintained a minimum GPA of 2.00 in the
 courses taken in that field.
 - If you have completed two years of study and are in good academic standing but have <u>not</u> achieved a GPA of
 2.00 in the intended major field of study, you *may* be permitted to register for one additional year.
 - If you are still <u>not</u> qualified to declare a major at the end of the additional year, you will <u>not</u> be permitted to
 enroll again unless you are approved as an exception by your major advisor and chair of the academic
 department.

Minors and certificates of curricular study must be declared by the last day of final examinations of a student's last semester of enrollment.

Instructions

- 1. Set up an appointment with the chair of each department or program in which you are declaring a program of study.
- 2. Prior to your appointment(s), run and print a "What-If" degree evaluation for your proposed program(s) of study:

Log in to your Banner self-service account

Follow the "Student Services" link

Follow the "Student Records" link

Follow the "Sewanee Online Degree Audit (SODA)" link (make sure you have enabled pop-ups for your browser)

After SODA opens, click on the "What-If" tab on the left side of your browser window

From the drop-down boxes, choose your:

Level = Undergraduate

Degree = Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science

Academic Year = Catalog year of your program of study you will follow

Major = One or more majors you intend to declare (you must choose at least one major)

Minor = Any minors you intend to declare (none required)

College = College of Arts and Sciences

Curricular Certificate = Any certificate of curricular study you intend to declare (none required)

Click the "Process What-If" button near the top of the page

Print or Save the "What-If" audit

- 4. Share your completed form and "What-If" audit with each chair and secure their signatures. If you are declaring a major, you must also secure the signature of the major advisor.
